Dear Parish Family,

I want to thank all the wonderful volunteers who assisted with this year's **Vacation Bible School**, in particular,

Beth O'Neill, coordinator. It was a great success and last week's closing Mass was truly beautiful. May God bless each and every one of you for giving this awesome experience to our children!

The old adage, "You can't take it with you," applies to today's Gospel story. In a world so consumed with consumerism, a culture so manipulated by materialism, a society so saturated by stuff, the words of Jesus present us with a great challenge. But with that challenge comes tremendous freedom. When we are able to really let go of our desire and passion for material things, there is great liberation in surrender. With our present economy, many people have little choice but to re-prioritize their lives. A good question to ask ourselves is: "Do I own my things or do my things own me?" The person with little has little distraction. I often wonder if the ultimate lifestyle portrayed by the media is really all that it is cracked up to be? Those with much have the pressure of maintaining it, allowing little freedom to do anything else. Those who have less are much more generous with what they have. As we look beyond the individual to our greater society, we see how greed has caused us so many problems: the oil spills in the Gulf and in China are the direct results of corporate and consumer greed. Global warming is yet another symptom of such a trend in the past few centuries. Our very planet is crying out for us to take a step back from our present course of self-destruction. Our first reading today from Ecclesiastes presents us all with a very harsh look in the mirror: *"Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity! For what profit comes to a man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun? All his days sorrow and grief are his occupation; even at night his mind is not at rest."*
